<p>May 15-16 0900-1700</p>	<p>ACLS 2 Day Full Course</p>	<p>Ojai Campus</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The goal is to improve outcomes in complex cardiovascular, respiratory and other (eg, metabolic, toxicologic) emergencies by expanding on core ACLS guidelines and encouraging critical thinking and decision-making strategies. Through instruction and active participation in case-based scenarios, learners enhance their skills in the differential diagnosis and treatment of pre-arrest, arrest and post-arrest patients.</li> </ul>
<p>May 1-2 0900-1700</p>	<p>PALS 2 Day Full Course</p>	<p>CMH Campus</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Describe the timely recognition and interventions required to prevent respiratory and cardiac arrest in any pediatric patient.</li> <li>Describe the systematic approach to pediatric evaluation by using the initial impression, primary, and secondary assessments, and diagnostic tests.</li> <li>Describe priorities and specific interventions for infants and children with respiratory and/or circulatory emergencies.</li> <li>Explain the importance of effective team dynamics during a pediatric resuscitation</li> <li>Describe the key elements of post-resuscitation management</li> <li>Perform high-quality CPR</li> <li>Perform effective respiratory management within your scope of practice</li> <li>Select and apply appropriate cardiorespiratory monitoring</li> <li>Select and administer appropriate medications and electrical therapies when presented with arrhythmia scenario</li> <li>Establish rapid vascular access to administer fluid medications</li> <li>Demonstrate effective communication and team dynamics both as a team member</li> </ul>
