Through instruction and active participation in case-based scenarios, learners enhance their skills in the differential diagnosis and treatment of pre-arrest, arrest and post-arrest patients.

Describe the systematic approach to pediatric evaluation by using the initial impression, primary, and secondary assessments, and diagnostic tests. Describe priorities and specific interventions for infants and children with respiratory and/or circulatory emergencies. Explain the importance of effective team dynamics during a pediatric resuscitation Describe the key elements of post-resuscitation management Perform high-quality CPR Perform effective respiratory management within your scope of practice Select and apply appropriate cardiorespiratory monitoring Select and administer appropriate medications and electrical therapies when presented with arrhythmia scenario Establish rapid vascular access to administer fluid medications Demonstrate effective communication and team dynamics both as a team member
